TMI

I live within a three mile radius of the nuclear power plant Three Mile Island. I remember, March 28, 1979 and the events that followed when there was an incident at the plant. I still went to work but my bags were packed ready for an immediate evacuation, in case of a total melt down. It was the most significant accident in U.S. commercial nuclear power plant history.

The accident began with failures in the non-nuclear secondary system, followed by a stuck-open pilot-operated relief valve in the primary system, which allowed large amounts of nuclear reactor coolant to escape. The mechanical failures were compounded by the initial failure of plant operators to recognize the situation as a loss-of-coolant. The partial meltdown resulted in the release of radioactive gases and radioactive iodine into the environment. [Wikipedia](#)

Governor Dick Thornburgh advised the evacuation "of pregnant women and pre-school age children within a five-mile radius of the Three Mile Island facility." The evacuation zone was extended to a 20-mile radius on Friday, March 30. About 140,000 people left the area. President Carter toured the problem plant on April 1. Within three weeks, 98% of the residents returned, but the issues around the accident continued.

In May 2017, it was [announced](#) that the plant was going to close with 700 jobs at risk. Also, in the same week, Penn State Medical Center [released](#) a study that linked thyroid cancer to the release of radiation from the plant which officials denied before. It is funny that today, 38 years later, we got in the mail around the evacuation and what do to plan in case of an emergency at Three Mile Island.

TMI is also an expression indicating that someone has divulged too much information of personal or taboo topics making the listener uncomfortable. I often cover my ears and say TMI when someone is talking about their bloody or medical details. People often consider politics and religion as taboo. I, even, get offended when others are trying to shove their religion down my throat. Their good intentions and presentations may bring negative results that could last for eternity.

For this reason, New Heart Beat Devotions has used real life interesting illustrations, with graphics, and internet links that normally appeal to most readers. As the reader gets involved with the presentation, they feel comfortable with the Godly message. The website, Facebook and mailings are not forced on anyone.
