Total Eclipse of the Son

Recently, an eclipse of the sun could be seen by many in the US. I was checking out at the store when the cashier took me out to see the eclipse with her special glasses. It was only a partial eclipse and it looked like a crescent moon. This was the second one that I had seen in my life. It seemed like everyone stopped for a few minutes to view the event. The next total one in the US is slated for August 23, 2044.

According to NASA, the first recorded eclipse took place on November 30, 3340 BC. Legend has it that two astrologers, His and Ho, were executed for failing to predict the October 22, 2134 BC eclipse. Clay tablets found at ancient archaeological sites show that the Babylonians not only recorded eclipses—the earliest known Babylonian record is of the eclipse that took place on May 3,1375 BC—but were also fairly accurate in predicting them.¹ The longest known totality was seven minutes and 28 seconds in 743 B.C.² During a 5,000-year period, the Earth will experience 11,898 eclipses of the sun.³

When there is a total eclipse of the sun, there is the absence of light, direction, and activity. This reminds me of when there is a total eclipse of the Son. There is the absence of light to the meaning of life. There is a lack of direction for life. There is no meaningful activity in life.
